



Sawn wood: Volume (m3) by Group






Round log: Volume (m3) by Group







Some key highlights: Vietnam – Laos timber trade



- Volume of import from Laos reduced in 2015 but still high: Challenges to bring the trade down
- Proportion of high value timber species is high (60-70% for logs, and > 80% for sawn wood)
- Most of wood imported through international checkpoints; some emerging national check points
- A large number of check points: Challenges to control the trade
- There are 5-6 key checkpoints with different dynamics (e.g. types of wood, timber species). What does this tell us?
 - Geopolitics ? Different level of stringent control across checkpoints ?
- Efforts to bring down the trade volume should focus on major checkpoints
- Lao Bao and Cau Treo are top checkpoints in in value (high value timber species/sawn wood), whereas Bo Y is top in volume (lower value species/round log)
- Is there any Lao timber imported to Vietnam through Cambodia ?
- Is the decrease in timber import to Vietnam from Laos (2015) real ?



Some key highlights: Vietnam – Cambodia timber trade



- Import has been a surge in 2015
- Most of import is high value timber
- Concerns from Cambodian authorities on CITES permits including those from granted by Lao authorities
- Recent Cambodia government's crackdown of timber trade to Vietnam reflects the problem of illegality associated with trade
- Timber trade relationship among Lao – Cambodia – Vietnam is still not clear
- Three timber associations and Forest Trends is working on Vietnam – Cambodia timber trade report
